This has been shaped in two official documents which are the “Debian Social Contract” and the “The Debian Free Software Guidelines” (DFSG). (limited to 65 words)</p>
<p><u>Bio of projector:</u> The Debian Project was officially founded by Ian Murdock (a german student at Purdue University in USA) on August 16th, 1993, motivated by the GNU Project and Linux kernel initiatives, thinking Debian as a distribution of Free Software which would be made openly and in which anyone could participate in its development entirely in community and freely. This</p>	<p><u>Activity:</u> The Debian Project is an association of individuals from all over the world who have made common cause to create an operating system with the best quality and as many programs as possible. As main activity, The Debian Project develops a full operating system as Free Software under principles of community and colaboration, always considering the needs of their users as the most important issue to provide the best software solutions inspired by GNU Project and implementing the best performance with Linux, BSD and Hurd kernels to make the technology needs of businesses, institutions and individuals in all over the globe, something more enjoyable to solve with constant improvement. For making this possible, the Debian Project developers</p>

resulted in the development of the first Debian GNU/Linux operating system, starting to release their first versions since 1993 until it became what it is now.

Debian's name is due to the combination of the name of Ian and his then girlfriend Deborah. The actual stable version is called Debian Wheezy 7 and it was released on May 4, 2013. Nowadays, Debian have a thousands of people that involved voluntarily in its development and and keeps growing constantly in different ways such as more software packages, translations and kernels included on it. and users have an anual conference called DebConf, which takes place every year in different parts of the world, making possible several days of work and directly live interaction among them to improve the Debian GNU/Linux operating system and their other variants with different kernels.
